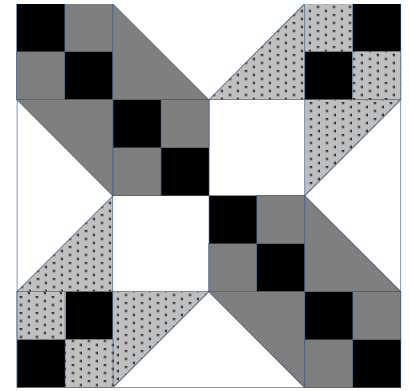


# September 2014 Block of the Month – Argyle

Instructions make two 10 ½" blocks (10" finished)



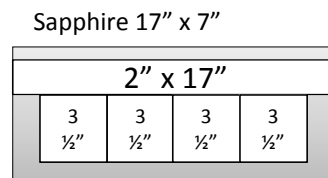
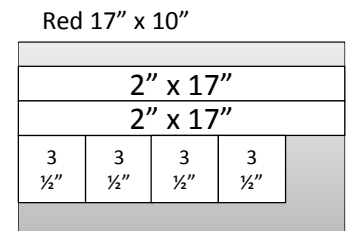
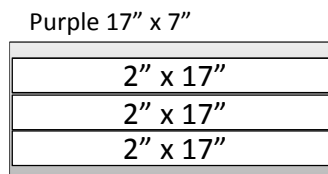
## Your kit should include:

- One Purple 17" x 7" rectangle
- One Red 17" x 10" rectangle
- One Sapphire 17" x 7" rectangle
- Technique Sheet for No Waste Flying Geese Variations 1

## Cutting Instructions:

Cream	Two 6 ½" squares Four 3" squares
Purple	Three 2" x 17" strips
Red	Two 2" x 17" strips Four 3 ½" squares
Sapphire	One 2" x 17" strip Four 3 ½" squares

See Yearly Cream Cutting Diagram (no focal fabric this month)

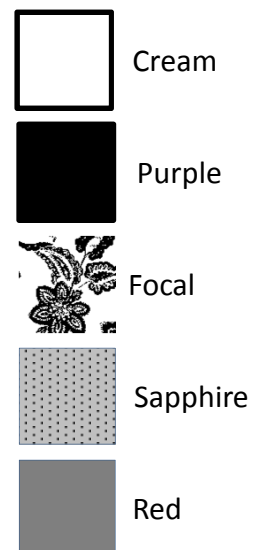


## 1. Make 4-Patch Units

- Stitch sapphire 2" x 17" strip to one of the purple 2" x 17" strips
- Press to one side.
- Cut into 2" wide segments.
- Stitch segments together in pairs, nesting seams, to make 4 four-patches
- Press seams in opposite directions to "pop" the center
- Trim to 3" square
- Repeat with red 2" x 17" strips and the remaining purple 2" x 17" strips

## 2. Make Eight Tri-Color Flying Geese

- Follow the No-Waste Flying Geese technique sheet **Variation 1** (make 2 sets)
- For each set, use:
  - One 6 ½" cream square (Fabric A)
  - Two 3 ½" red squares (Fabric B)
  - Two 3 ½" sapphire squares (Fabric C)
- Trim geese to 5 ½" x 3"

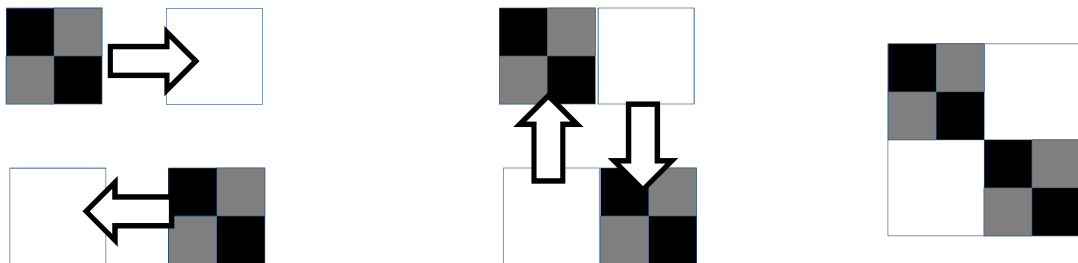


# September 2014 Block of the Month – Page 2

## Assemble Blocks:

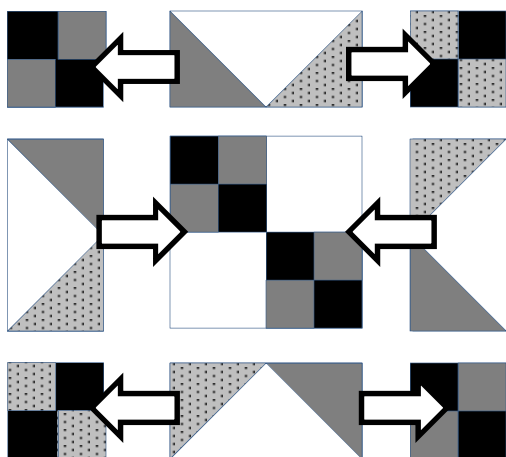
Combine two purple/red 4-patch units with two cream 3" squares to form center unit.

**Make sure the purple squares line up along the diagonal..** Press seams as shown & pop centers



Sew rows 1-3 as shown, pressing in the direction of the arrows.

**Make sure the purple squares line up along the diagonal.**



Join rows 1-3 together & press seams toward the outside.
