



Block of the Month

Maker's Choice

Hello, this month's block will be using four 2.5" strips. You can choose four random colors, making sure that there is some contrast in color between the strips. Or, you can choose four strips from the same color family, and again, make sure there is some contrast between the colors. By contrast I mean that if you took a photo (using the monochromatic setting) of your four strips side by side you would see four obviously different fabrics.

Arrange your strips in an order that pleases you. Place right sides together, then sew them in pairs, stitching on the long side of the strip. Press towards the dark fabrics. Next sew the two strip sets together and press toward the darker fabric. You should now have a strip set of four 2.5" strips sewn together.

Trim up one of the short edges evenly. Measure your strip set from the top strip to the bottom strip. Whatever this measurement is, that is what you will cut your segments along the strip. You want to be cutting squares to make a block. For example, if your strip set measures 8 ¼" from the top color to the bottom color, then cut 8 ¼" segments along the strip. I was able to get four segments from my strip set.

Now for the neat part!! Place one block with your stripes going vertical, and then place a second block right sides together on top of the first block with the stripes going horizontal. Pin edges together. Sew a ¼" seam all the way around the outside of the blocks. Then, cut the block you just made on the diagonal from corner to corner. And again, on the other diagonal, cut from corner to corner. You should have four triangles now. Open them up and press toward the flat edge. Trim off the dog ears (those little bits of fabric hanging around). If you were able to get four blocks from your strip set, sew the second set of blocks the same way-right sides together with one block horizontal and one block vertical. Look at the cool designs you have to work with now!!

Play with different arrangements of four blocks before sewing them to make your own Block of the Month pattern for February!

This pattern idea came from watching a YouTube Missouri Star tutorial where Jenny Doan shows how to make this block from a variation that 3Dudes Quilting used on a Jenny Doan pattern.

St. Patrick's Day - the real story

Patrick was British, not Irish. Patrick was born in the age when the Roman Empire controlled Britain. When he was 16, he was captured by Irish pirates and forced into slavery for six years before he escaped. Patrick eventually became a Catholic missionary and returned to Ireland.

The popular fable states that Patrick achieved sainthood by driving the snakes from Ireland. It's more likely Ireland never had any snakes. During the Ice Age, about 10,000 years ago, the climate in Ireland was inhospitable to the cold-blooded reptiles. A more likely explanation of the fable is that "snakes" are an allegory for druids. Patrick did convert the druids to Christianity.

Given St. Patrick's devotion, it's ironic that two symbols associated with this day are blarney - the leprechaun and the four-leaf clover. There is a tie to St. Patrick, it's just that it has too many leaves. St. Patrick used the three-leaf clover to teach the Christian belief of the holy trinity. And, as for all those green top hats with buckles worn by bleary adults, the earliest descriptions of leprechauns say the legendary sprites wore red.

The celebration of St. Patrick's Day dates to March 17, 466, on the fifth anniversary of Patrick's death. It bore little resemblance to modern festivities. It was one of the holiest days on the calendar, There would have been at least one similarity. It was a feast, so alcohol would have been served.

Many Irish came to the United States in the 1840s during the potato famine. Then, America was undergoing a spate of nationalism and was less than welcoming to the Irish.

The idea that modern Americans would want to celebrate their Irish heritage, or even pretend to have it, is relatively new.
