


Slide show of desserts and **bring and brag** submitted to **Kriss Gross** before meeting.

## Antique Quilts

It's tough to accurately date a quilt unless you're an antiques appraiser, but by looking for a few clues, you can deduce its general age. Vintage quilts were made from the 1930s to 1965, while quilts deemed antique date back to 100 years ago or more. A quilt made in the 1920s or earlier is also considered antique.

Most antique and vintage quilts were made by hand with no help from a sewing machine. Many antique quilts were made in odd sizes that don't fit modern beds. Handmade quilts, particularly those from the 20th century, sometimes bear a label on the bottom corner. The label tells the name and location of the quilter, as well as the date of completion. Quilts made prior to the 20th century might not have a tag.

Patchwork-style quilts first became common in the 18th century and after the American Revolutionary War. Certain patterns can help identify an antique quilt. The double wedding ring pattern is thought to have German origins. The pattern was first published in 1928 in "Capper's Weekly" magazine. The grandmother's flower garden can be traced back to the 18th century. Quilts with either of these patterns may be considered antique.

A quilt's weaving pattern, or the way it was sewn, is a clue to age; plain weave is the most common type. With this weave, warp and filler threads pass over one another in alternating rows. Plain weave is found in both vintage and modern quilts, so it's not ideal for aging a piece. Twill-weave quilts have threads with a diagonal pattern; denim is an example of twill weaving. It was a popular antique quilt weave from 1880 to 1920.

A quilt's colors may help you identify its general age. For example, Lancaster blue consists of a light-blue print over a dark-blue background. This color was popular on antique quilts from 1860 to 1880. Double pink is a similar hue; it depicts a dark-pink shade over a light-pink background. Double pink was commonly seen in quilts from the 1860s to the 1880s as well as the 1920s. Cheddar orange, also called antimony, was used in applique in Pennsylvania from 1860 to 1880. Nile green, a type of pale green, was common on vintage quilts in the 1930s through 1940s. The color was often paired with cream, white or dark green.

### Lauren Markell - GVQG Recipes

Many of our members are great cooks and bakers... I thought it might be fun to share some recipes during this time.

We realize there are also some who do not like the adventure of cooking/baking, but perhaps you have a recipe to share that someone else might enjoy and even bring to an event or meeting.

Carolyn and I have talked and we decided that it would be fun to have a section on the guild's Web site, where there is unlimited space, and call it GVQG Recipes. As you feel inspired, please submit one, or many over time, of your **favorite** recipes for the Web site - NO images, type written please. It can be in ANY category - main dish, dessert, salad . . . you name it. Be sure YOUR name is included.

#### Lemon Icebox Cookies

2 cups of flour                      1 cup confectioners sugar  
 1tsp salt                                1 tbs plus 1 tsp lemon zest  
 1 tsp fresh lemon juice  
 Two sticks cold butter cut in pieces (1 cup)  
 Two egg yolks  
 1/4 cup sugar for rolling.

In a food processor combine flour, sugar, salt, lemon zest, and butter and process till granular.

Add egg yolks, lemon juice, butter and pulse till dough comes together.

Roll out on a lightly sugared parchment paper and form into two logs... 1 1/2 in wide.

Slice 1/4"

Oven 350 degrees - Turn pan once while baking. baking time is 15 minutes and turn sheet after 7 minutes.

Watch closely as they burn easily since they contain butter.

This dough also freezes well, just wrap in Saran wrap and freeze on a tray. Unthaw in refrigerator overnight, slice and bake.

These are a really yummy cookie and everyone loves them.

Please join Sheila and Linda for a Zoom virtual sewing session on Saturday, June 27 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. We'll be sewing a cute pattern and you can probably finish the top that day. We've sent an email to the author hoping for permission to use a pattern in my library. If permission isn't granted, we have another pattern lined up for backup. Either pattern would be appropriate for a community service quilt, but this is just for fun so don't feel guilty if you decide to keep it for yourself or give it to a friend. We'll send out the Zoom link Friday evening and reveal the pattern at that time. To participate, click the link to join our Zoom session from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Throughout the session, you may chat with your friends and watch our drawings for fun prizes! (Don't expect a million bucks; it's just something fun donated by a guild member.)

To make the quilt with the pattern we're hoping to get permission to use, you'll need:

- 9 complimentary fat quarters
- 1/3 yd of fabric for the inner border
- 7/8 yd of fabric for the outer border
- 2 yds of fabric for the backing
- 1/2 yd of fabric for the binding.
- Batting - needs to be bigger than 42" x 63"

-OR-

To make the backup pattern, you'll need:

- 9 complimentary fat quarters
- 1/2 yd of fabric for the binding
- Backing and batting - needs to be bigger than 48" x 60"

While we wait for permission, you can look through your stash for 9 complimentary fat quarters. We'll let you know as soon as possible whether or not you need fabric for the inner and outer borders in the first pattern.




