Sew Along News

For those of you who enjoyed making **Luv Ya** last mont who love heart themed quilts and who are no longer intimidated by the infamous HST (half square triangle), have I got a quilt for you! Do a google search on **Exploding Hearts**. I saw it today done in golds, orange and browns on a creamy white background. We won't k making it in a sew-along session, but if there's enough interest, we might sew it in 5-6 midweek sessions to encourage each other.

This month our Sew-Along pattern is Villa Rosa's Color Box. According to the instructions on the card, you nee to cut 280 colorful 2 1/2 inch squares along with 35 whi ones. These get assembled into 9 patch blocks with a white center square. If this is more than you can stand, faster way to build your blocks would utilize a half jelly I (18 strips) and 3 white 2 1/2 inch by WOF strips. To get more variety in your 9 patches, divide each 2 1/2 inch strip in half, cutting on the short side. Mix and match in 14 groups of 3 making sure that 5 strip sets have white strips in the center position. Sew your groups of strips together along the long side. Press the colored strip set to the left. Press the strip sets with white centers to the right. Now subcut your strip sets into new 2 1/2 inch strips. Mix and match 3 of your new strip sets into 9 patch blocks with a white block in the center position.

If this is clear as mud, prep for the sew-along by selecti 18 colored 2 1/2 inch by WOF strips and 3 white ones. We'll do the rest in our sewing session after the demo. See you on Saturday, February 27th.
