Claudia Forrester and I visited the WE CARE site in Grass Valley last week.

There we witnessed in action, the wonderful efforts that Kathy Bigis and her volunteer team do in collecting, sorting, tagging and wrapping donated quilts and matching pillow cases that come in from all over the world even as far as Australia!

Since 2015, Kathy Biggis and her volunteer team have hand delivered hundreds of thousands of quilts and pillow cases to children in grades K-12 who have lost their homes to wildfires. The day we visited they were sorting for children of the Caldor fire.

Claudia and I were very pleased and honored to donate 16 beautiful quilts to WE CARE on behalf of GVQG.

Kathy, Shirley and others who make the deliveries say that watching each grade, each classroom, each child file through the line and select their quilt or quilt set is so fulfilling and rewarding. And that the pillow case may not just be to hold a pillow, but for the child's personal belongings.

And every year since 2015, they have made the trip, with quilt kits in hand, to Clearlake.

Sew Along

You have your choice of two patterns - the Villa Rosa pattern is Bohemia; the other option is Two Fabric Bargello by Susie Weaver, available on Amazon. This pattern has three variations – Swirl, Checkmark and Lightening Bolt. Both patterns require two fabrics, an ombre and a focal fabric, but the requirements are different. I'll bring some samples to our next meeting but would like to know before then if you're planning to attend the class.
