Candice began sewing when she was in middle school and made all her dresses

The first quilt she made was for her second child, followed by a small lap quilt for her mother-in-law in the '90's, and then didn't do any quilting until 2012 when her interest was rekindled and she's been happily involved in the quilting community ever since. Her interest in Hawaiian Quilting began with a class taught by Carrie Fondi at the 2014 Reno Quilt Show. The Loki Lani quilt that she completed from that class won 3rd Place at the 2015 California State Fair. Candice's business (CandyBanks Studio) includes custom free-motion quilting, binding, and InkJet printing of Labels or Photos on fabric in addition to making custom quilts. She enjoys sharing skills she's learned with others and challenging them to attempt new ways of expressing themselves in the quilting arts.

Opportunity Quilt Travel

Positive reasons for someone to fill this position at this point:

Schedule pretty much set (I'm still working on a couple) and many members have already volunteered.

There is a Binder with all the details (and then some) to help them.



Opportunity Quilt Travel Responsibilities:

- Responsible for:
 - (1) The Opportunity Quilt,
 - (2) Quilt Stand,
 - (3) Cart and items within,
 - (4) Inventory of tickets and postcards, etc
- Find volunteers to travel as needed
- Make sure the 'traveler' has the cart (cash box, tickets, stand, and quilt in timely manner.
- Collect revenue after each event, and turn in at each Guild Meeting (see sample forms in your 'pink' binder)

2023 Opportunity Quilt Development

This is definitely a multi person job. Select a pattern and get approval from the Board. Then collect then fabrics, make the quilt, and have it quilted. Present the quilt to the membership at the Christmas Party.

Community Service

Collect quilts from the members at guild meetings, divide them up and let the members that distribute them take them home. Create labels using the label stamp as needed.

Plan themes, decorations, and activities for the Tea, Ice Cream Social, and Christmas Party.
