

Sew-Along News

The Sew-Along selection for August 13, 2022 is: **Pointless -** 52" x 61"

- ¹/₄ yd each of 3 yellows, 2 greys, 1 pink
- Background....1³/₄ yd
- Binding....¹/₂ yd

It's back to school time once again. Why not relive your youth and add some humor with a pencil quilt? I found navy background fabric with gold and silver stars. I admit I got my fair share of red and blue stars too, but loved seeing the gold and silver ones on my papers. Sadly, I hear teachers today can't motivate that way.

This pattern also has a mini version titled *Lil' Pointless*, available on the Running Doe website.

We will be doing strip sewing then sub cutting and attaching rectangles. No HST, no flying geese, no curves. Nothing to take your mind off your Zoom conversation. Stay cool indoors and join us on Zoom for a sewing/gab session this Saturday from 10am – 2pm. Carolyn will send out an invitation and link to our Zoom session early Saturday morning. Look for it in email.

The pattern is available at Swifty Stitches for \$2, or you may purchase a digital copy on the Villa Rosa website. There's also a mini version of the quilt, titled "Lil' Pointless". Purchase a digital copy of the little quilt on the Running Doe website. If you're sewing this one for Community Service, ask Hazel for a 60" x 70" piece of our new Dream Green batting. It's long-arm friendly!

And if you like to plan ahead, you have a decision to make for September. You have a choice between two similar patterns. *Wistful* uses a jelly roll or 40 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips; while *Tulsa Town* uses 15 FQ or 27 - $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Both patterns make a 57" x 72" quilt. Hazel made a wheel-chair version of *Tulsa Town*, pictured in last month's newsletter. Contact her for specifics. This session is September 24th, after we've had a chance to recover from our wonderful luncheon.

Share & care

Hazel Williams - I had an unfortunate meeting with a dog on July 14. Here's the story....

I was invited for lunch and cards at my friend's (Selma), home. She lives in a "Granny House" next to her daughter's (Shelly) huge home at the end of a dead-end road in Orangevale. They share the back yard.

I parked my red car in front of Shelly's home, & started walking to Selma's. Shelly's dog, a Springer Spaniel, which was suppose to be confined, attacked me. It tore skin on my left knee in 2 places with its paw, and bit my left little finger severely.

Shelly's teenage son saw the attack and stopped the dog, or it could have been worse. (Fortunately, I wasn't knocked down.) He ran inside to alert Shelly, who is a nurse; & also, fortunately, was home.

My finger was bleeding so badly, I couldn't stop it; so by the time I rang Selma's doorbell, there was a trail of blood on the sidewalk.

Shelly came running over & took over. Hanging my hand over the sink, she poured peroxide again & again over my finger until the wound stopped fizzing.

I was traumatized. Seeing all that fizzing was too much for me; I could feel myself going to faint. I was sitting on a bar stool, so Selma got ice packs and held me up. I became extremely clammy, soaking my blouse. I didn't completely faint, but came awfully close.

Shelly suggested I go to Emergency to get stitches. I didn't want to further ruin my day, so I told her to wrap my finger tightly instead.

Once all the bandages (2 on my knee and 3 on my finger were put on, they helped me to the sofa to recover. I felt awful for some time.

The blood oozed out of the bandages on my finger all day. (I should have gone to Emergency for stitches.)

Next morning I found blood on my sheet. I sent a message to my doctor. I told him Shelly informed me the dog had all its shots, so it didn't have Rabies; & I believed my Tetanus shot was up-to-date. My doctor responded right away, prescribing an antibiotic.

It took 7 days for the deep, jagged wound in my finger to stop bleeding. I feel I was blessed the dog only had 3 teeth; otherwise, it might have bit my finger off!!!






