July Program Community Service Sew Day

Our Community Service Sew Day will be here soon. This time Pat Fryer, of Villa Rosa Designs, donated the "Star Spangled" pattern which is a nice lap size measuring 48" x 60". Do it up in patriotic colors because it's July or get a jump on the holidays like Lauren by using Christmas fabrics!

If you didn't pick up your free pattern card at our June meeting, we gave Susan at Swifty Stitches a stack of the pattern cards to keep under the counter. They are free to Golden Valley members who would like to participate in this project, but you have to ask for them. If you don't mind waiting until the night of the meeting, you can still gather your fabric. You will need: blue $-1\frac{14}{4}$ yd, white $-\frac{34}{4}$ yd, binding $-\frac{14}{2}$ yd.

On Thursday, July 28, 2022 we will meet together from 4-9 pm with a very brief meeting at 7pm. Come when you can, stay as long as you like. Bring your sewing machine, fabric and tools needed to sew this simple pattern. The guild will have cutting mats and Irons available for use. We will give tips and tricks on constructing the pattern and you will likely be able to finish the top in the evening. We'll even provide you with batting. Also, bring your own brown bag dinner or/ plan on popping out to one of the great local restaurants. We will begin cleaning up by 8:30pm so we can be out the doors on time by 9pm.

Snippets - (continued from page 1.)

Have you heard of a sniglet? They are words that should exist but don't. Here are some sniglets I came across:

- Boboblivion continuing to sew a seam unaware that the bobbin thread has run out.
- Triblets the tiny triangle corners cut off half-square triangle seams.
- Thrundles the little bundles of tangled thread attached to fabric after washing and drying.
- Blockamuk sewing one block either upside down or sideways.
- Squichshort the area not covered by fabric when paper-piecing.
- Erratiseams seams that don't match.
- Nilfabrication running out of a primary fabric.
- Subfabrication substituting a different fabric after running out of the first.

If you know of any other quilting-related sniglets, let me know and we will include them in another newsletter.

- 1. We meet on Zoom. Stay in your jammies if you wish; or feel free to get a group together and log in as one.

Share & Care

Hazel Williams - Not wanting to make Villa Rosa's **English Garden** full size, I made a smaller version using a Jelly Roll, which turned out to be 41"x 43" including the binding. The Jelly Roll had two 2-1/2" strips of 10 different fabrics. I started the center with two 2-1/2" squares.



Hazel Williams - The CS workshop in September shows 2 similar Villa Rosa patterns. Since I already had the TULSA TOWN pattern & plenty of brown fabric scraps I got from the free table, I set to work. I've learned the optimum sizes for CS quilts are approximately 40" x 50", and 40" square for children and wheelchair patients. Generally, Villa Rosa patterns are larger than that, so I most always cut the designs down to a smaller size. First, I cut the fabric pieces per the pattern instructions, knowing I'd have toomany. I made the blocks, which were 10" wide x 12-1/2" long.My first arrangement came out like this, making the quilt 40" x 48".





Jane Samuelson - This bed is Victorian, late 19th century, Renaissance Revival in style. It was in my grandmother's Italianate house in San Francisco, and being laid down on it for a nap is among my earliest memories.

Grandma's second husband, Frank Bradley, was a bachelor and lived with his parents. When he married Grandma she moved in with them. I don't remember Frank's parents but he and Grandma had a suite on the second floor; a bedroom and living room with a drapery separating the rooms. The living room had a bow window looking down on Capp Street, a fireplace, and a sink. There was a dining table and I remember a family dinner there but don't know how they cooked!

The bed was always there, huge and impressive. When Grandma retired (she was a teacher) she moved to Dixon in order to be near her daughter, my mother. The bed came to Dixon along with the dresser, whose mirror is as tall as the bed headboard, and a commode which is by the bed. These two pieces have marble tops. There is a label stencilled in a drawer: Pacific Furniture Factory, 736 Brannan St.,SF. The factory was established in 1877.

This bed has moved again: first to my house in Berkeley, then to my son Don's house in Sacramento because they needed a bed and my husband didn't like this bed, and now to my apartment in Sacramento. I hope and expect it will stay here. I love it.

I should say that Grandma was a quilter and the bed has had a lot of quilts on it.


