Getting to Know You - Faith Grunwaldt

For Sacramento residents, Ruth & Sydney Earls, February 19, 1948 was a very special day - their first child, Faith, was born. Faith thinks she was born on a Wednesday but, alas, "Alexa" says that date was on a Thursday. Faith's father was a very talented ceramic tile layer and he was flown all over the place to do special tile jobs. Her mother was always a homemaker. As years passed, Faith acquired several siblings - Jerry, 17 months younger, Phyllis, 4 years younger, and Bonnie, 8 years younger.

Faith has some really early memories. . . she clearly remembers a night when she was standing up in her crib, holding onto the railing, crying, "Ma-ma, Ma-ma." She remembers her mother opening the door, the light coming in and then . . . mom must have gotten her back to sleep - she must have been less than 1 ½ years old. She reluctantly shared how she use to hold her little brother between her legs and slap until he cried - but then, just like her mother did, she could comfort him and make him stop crying. When he got quiet she would slap him again so she could comfort him gain. Their mom finally became aware of what she was doing and put a stop to that.

Faith first lived in the Lemon Hill/Fruitridge area of Sacramento. She attended Peter Burnett Elementary School for Kindergarten. During 1st grade they moved to Rancho Cordova to a brand new **wonderful** house. Rancho Cordova Elementary School wasn't built yet so she had to be bused to Mather Field Elementary School. With the new school now completed she transferred to Rancho Cordova Elementary - but only to attend 3rd & 4th grades. In 3rd grade Faith wrote really good stories - so good that she was sent around to other classrooms to read them. Rancho Cordova Elementary was not big enough (yet) so, she got bused to Folsom's Theodore Judah Elementary for 5th & 6th grades. THEN, for 7,8, & 9th grades, she was back to Rancho Cordova attending the new Mills Junior High School. Her best memories are of 7th grade Home Ec class - the Asian teacher told Faith that she "made the flakiest biscuits in the class" and, of all things, they were taught how to make Egg Foo Young.

There were some rocky times as Faith was getting to be high school age. Dad, upsetting the whole family, decided to sell their **wonderful** house so he could afford to get a contractor's license. They moved to Fair Oaks, where she attended Bella Vista High School for her freshman & sophomore years. Then they moved back to Rancho Cordova and she started her junior year at Cordova High School, then they moved to Orangevale so she was back at Bella Vista for her senior year - graduating in 1966.

The father of Faith's best friend got her a job with the CA DMV. Faith and a co-worker at the DMV, got an apartment together. Faith had been dating a guy who was stationed at Mather A.F.B. and Faith ended up pregnant - the father disappeared. After 3 years with the DMV, when she was within 2 weeks of her due date, she quit her job. Her daughter, Kelly, born in 1969. When her daughter was 1 month old Faith went to work for Sacramento County in Adult Probation and, then, transferring to Foster Home Licensing. It was an unsettling

time - in the beginning, Faith and her daughter lived with her parents, then with friends in Loomis, then sometimes renting a house here and there. When her daughter was 5, Faith married a man she thought would be a great father but - after 4 months, for a **VERY** substantial reason, Faith divorced him. In 1983 she finally bought her own home. This allowed her daughter go all through high school at Lincoln High School. After a few years of working for the county, in 1977 - 1986, she went to work for the Placer High School District in Auburn. She held that job for 9 years - she was the attendance secretary/registrar and SHE LOVED THAT JOB! However, she moved on and went to work for Koinonia Foster Homes as the secretary for the Executive Officer.

All through her life Faith has been deeply involved with her church, Crossroads Community Church in Rocklin. One day, a Mercy Ship was at the Port of Sacramento and Kelly, now 19, went to tour it and came home and told Faith, "That's what you've got to do, mom!" For 2 months Faith **really struggled** with that idea but she finally visited their closest base office, which is up in Chico, for a weekend. She began to feel/realize, and accept, that this was her calling. She easily sold her house, she completed the necessary training, and she went to Mexico as a missionary with Youth with a Mission. Faith returned home after 3 years because Kelly needed her. Upon arriving back in Sacramento, she found a job with the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors where she worked for 15 years. Faith also worked part-time for a Christian dating service. There, she met, Tom (a Sheriff's Deputy) and they married in 1997. They were married for 22 wonderful years, but it was often quite a struggle because Tom had Parkinson's disease. Faith retired in 2010 and a year later, Tom needed care beyond Faith's abilities so, he was in a care facility his last 8 years.

Faith, like so many of us, made the usual apron in junior high home economics class. Using her mom's Kenmore, she managed to teach herself how to sew all kinds of things. Her sister Phyllis (also a GVQG member) dragged her along to a quilt guild but they realized they didn't want to continue with that group. Phyllis found our GVQG and finally talked Faith into joining too. These days, Faith spends a lot of time at Swift's and Cameo's Sit & Sew.

Faith now has 3 grandchildren, but they all live in Dallas. Faith has her little Dachshund, Leah, now 13+, and when she passes over the rainbow bridge Faith plans on moving to Dallas, close to family, and probably will spend her free time on her computer playing hidden object games - she will definitely continue to make quilts.





Last March was the first "Getting to Know You" submissions for the newsletter and, I have decided that this March's submission will be the last. I have only 1 more person who, very reluctantly, said she would volunteer but she can now breathe a sigh of relief and spend her time & energy preparing for her new GVQG board position.

Help Wanted - Committees

It takes many hands to run our guild. There are lots of little jobs, so necessary and some just for fun. Below is a list of committees that need to be filled, as well as a brief description of what is involved. Please read through them and let me know how you can help.

- Member-at-Large: This is a Board Position. This person is mainly the go between the members and the Board. A suggestion box is placed on the membership table, for members to write suggestions, or if they have an issue, and the Member-at-Large presents them to the Board at Board meetings.
- Opportunity Quilt Travel Committee: Communicates via email with others guilds and schedules our Opportunity Quilt to visit them, and their Opportunity Quilt to visit us. Sharon Baxter has done this job for many years, and has the schedule pretty much set for the coming year, and has a wealth of information to help you.
