JUNE WORKSHOP:

Paula Harden, speaker June 22,2023

Presenting English Paper Pieced quilts

and projects at our June 22nd meeting.

Paula always wanted to make things and was taught to sew by her sister, to whom she is forever grateful. Since then, her hands have never been idle as a sewing or embroidery project was always in progress. In the late 1980's she stumbled upon Mary Hickey's book, "Little by Little-Quilts in Miniature." A spark was ignited in her soul and has continued to burn since that day. She devoured every quilting book she could find and soon found herself drawn to antique quilts and needle turn applique. Her love for English Paper Piecing came years later as she struck up a friendship with a blogger in Canada. With her help and encouragement, she dove into the craft head first and hasn't look back. She still has several EPP or embroidery projects going at the same time.

The Guild is offering a class on English Paper Piecing Techniques on Saturday, June 24th, 2023. You will learn to create those beautiful blocks and perhaps experience the same spark that Paula experienced a long time ago. A kit of supplies (template, papers, fabric, and special goodies) is required and can be purchased for \$18. in class. Students will learn and practice EPP, leave with resources and ideas for projects, and will know where to buy supplies. Free patterns are available on the internet.





TIPS and TRICKS

Fellow Quilters, I do not know who put this darling patriotic dog fabric on the FREE table, but it was just enough to make a Modified S'Witched quilt, which is 40" x 50".



Modified S'Witched quilt:

To makes this quilt, first you need the original pattern from Villa Rosa Designs, and you need 26" of 2 fabrics.

- 1 Cut 3 strips WOF 8-5/8" wide of both fabrics.
- 2 Cut across each strip 10-1/2"; thus making 24 rectangles.
- 3 Then proceed to sew them together per the original S'Witched pattern directions.
