Our presenter for May will be Helen Rice, who is a great believer in recycling fabric. Rather than have a workshop on Memorial Weekend, she will teach a Rooster Collage class on Saturday, May 20th. By the end of class, you will have produced a 16" x 20" Rooster using your bright colored or small motif fabric scraps or you may buy a kit of scraps from Helen. During the class you will construct the rooster on an Appliqué2 or Fusing mat. The completed Rooster will then be placed on the background fabric and further embellishments, such as flowers, will be added.

This is a fun way to use some of your Kaffe Fassett scraps and when finished you will have a wall hanging, pillow top, or a nice gift for a rooster fan.

A Laura Heine pattern is required which can be purchased from Helen on the day of the class for \$25. unless you already have one. A supply list will be available when you sign up for the class.

Meeting Minutes - February 23, 7:00pm

The board met 10 minutes prior to the General Meeting and approved the proposed 2023-24 GVQG Budget.

General Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Member February Birthdays were acknowledged.

No Visiting guild this month.

Approval of minutes — There were no corrections to the January 2023 General Meeting Minutes: they were approved as distributed.

Newsletter Deadline announced as March 9, 2023

Next Board Meeting will be March 9, 2023 from 6:30 to 8:00 pm. It will be a combined meeting of the outgoing 2022-23 and incoming 2023-24 GVQG Boards at Sheila Galuza's home.

The new Board for 2023-24 was approved by the membership. It was announced that Carolyn Monson is retiring from the Newsletter and Website at the end of this fiscal year after 12 years of service to the guild. We are looking for two or more people to fill the need.

Officer Reports:

Martha Hess — Opportunity Quilt tickets are available tonight for those who've already paid and anyone who would like to buy some. This fund raiser is the core resource for funding


special speakers and many of our general expenses.

Seminole Patchwork Workshop

Generally it was thought that all Seminole was small pieces. That is not always the case. The "bands" can be made any size you wish. There are four kinds of bands:1-alternate, 2-stair step, 3-floating, and 4-angle. We will make one of each with options for making the smaller sizes. These can be used in all kinds of ways from decoration for skirts or other articles of clothing (as is typical of the Seminole Indians, to bands in a quilt, table runner, placemat, or borders on a quilt.





For the Seminole Patchwork Workshop on Saturday, March 25th, you will need to bring to class, a cutting mat (the guild will also have some larger community mats available to use), rotary cutter, ruler at least 6 inches wide, sewing machine, 5 colors of fabric (1/2 yard each). The fabric needs to be 40-45 " wide.


The weather outside is frightful so grab a project and Zoom with us from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. this Saturday.



GVQG ZEPHYR POINT RETREAT APPLICATION

Join us for a five-day retreat at Zephyr Point Conference Center, located on beautiful Lake Tahoe, a few miles northeast of South Lake Tahoe, in Zephyr Cove, Nevada.

Sunday, June 4th to Friday, June 9th, 2023

We are offering a three-tier system depending on how many members are in a room. The room rate is a flat \$140 a night and meals are \$224. Our setup/takedown fee of \$275 will be divided up between the number of attendees we have. We have 13 rooms available for us and we need a minimum of 20 meal plans purchased.

Member Fee: approximately \$475 to \$675 Nonmember Fee: approximately \$495 to \$695
