MAY WORKSHOP:

Our presenter for May will be Helen Rice, who is a great believer in recycling fabric. Rather than have a workshop on Memorial Weekend, she will teach a Rooster Collage class on Saturday, May 20th. By the end of class, you will have produced a 16" x 20" Rooster using your bright colored or small motif fabric scraps or you may buy a kit of scraps from Helen. During the class you will construct the rooster on an Appliqué2 or Fusing mat. The completed Rooster will then be placed on the background fabric and further embellishments, such as flowers, will be added.

This is a fun way to use some of your Kaffe Fassett scraps and when finished you will have a wall hanging, pillow top, or a nice gift for a rooster fan.

A Laura Heine pattern is required which can be purchased from Helen on the day of the class for \$25. unless you already have one. A supply list will be available when you sign up for the class.

JUNE is the month we will be learning about English paper piecing with Paula Harden. She has taught classes for Quilters Corner before they closed and is highly respected in the field of English paper piecing.

The class which will be held on June 24th will provide learners with her techniques, resources and ideas for projects, including free patterns available on the internet, and where to buy supplies. A kit of supplies is necessary for the class at \$18. It includes template, papers, and other goodies. Please bring cash. There are openings at \$40. 

TIPS and TRICKS

Fellow Quilters, I want to encourage you to use your scraps & miscellaneous strips (any width) for Community Service quilts. Here's an example with directions you might want to use.





15" of fabric needed for twenty 3"x10" horizontal rectangles. Strips of fabric need to be WOF, & can be any width. Make your own strips out of scraps for variety.

Directions:

- 1 Sew together lengthwise enough WOF strips that will measure 10" across.
- 2 Sew 4 sets (strata's) of these 10" wide strata's.
- 3 Cut across each strata into 7-3/4" sections; this makes 20 sections.
- 4 Sew the sections to the rectangles. (See the example above.)
- 5 Trim to make 10" squares.
- 6 Arrange the blocks as per example above.
- 7 This makes a guilt top approximately 39" x 48".
