



Got Fleece...that you want to donate to a good cause? By Chris Aceituno-Phelan

First, thank you for welcoming and supporting our Canine Companion puppies and making them feel welcome at the Guild's meetings and workshops. I think I can speak for Sue, Karen, Jody, Debbie, Linda and myself when I say your support is deeply appreciated. Most often, these puppies begin their journey in the home of a volunteer who helps mama birth these amazing dogs and nurture them for the first 8 weeks. A plastic wading pool is usually their "labor and deliver room" and their "nursery" for the first few weeks. Fleece covers provide a single, soft underlayer so the puppies don't get stuck under a blanket or other bedding. This fleece cover also provides some traction for those babies to help them make their way around the pool and toward mom when it's time to nurse and tend to dull the cracking sound that the plastic pools make when mom moves around.

We are in the process of making these covers and I'm looking for donations of fleece and 3/4 or 1" elastic. If you have either of these items in your stash from projects or hobbies that you've abandoned, I would be thrilled to take it off your hands. And/or, perhaps someone you know has these items and would also like to donate them to a great cause; please pass the word.
