

## Website update . . . (as of December 10, 2023)

We humans make an infinite number of decisions every day. Decisions that result in positive outcomes, leave us feeling empowered and pretty darn good about ourselves. Decisions that don't turn out as expected can be quite the bummer.

I was reading many things about how great Apple's new iMac M3 computer was going to be and . . . I decided I wanted to replace my old computer. So, I set my alarm to wake me up at 4:55 am, on Tuesday, November 7th, so I would be successful in ordering mine on the very 1st day they became available at 5am. My new computer was delivered to my house on November 13th. I was quite terrified by the thought that I was going to be responsible for transferring all my data to the new computer. However, the process turned out to be quite easy - as most things usually are with Apple products.

**BUT...** something happened that put this decision I had made to upgrade to the iMac M3 computer into "quite the bummer" category. Rapid Weaver, the program I use to create the guild's Website, DID NOT WORK!

Along came my knight in shining armor, "Steve," who lives in the UK, and "just tries to help people" via the Rapid Weaver Forum. A forum which I had never participated in until this disaster struck. I posted my story, emphasizing my age and pointing out my lack of understanding of what to do. Steve, taking pity on me, took the time, by viewing our Website, to sort of recreate it on his computer and, by never giving up on me, he finally got me to understand that my Rapid Weaver file was missing an item called 'Content.plist' (I had/have no idea what that was/is - STILL). We determined that this, unfortunately, was going to require my installing an update on my computer. I could never have figured this out without Steve's help. We would have lost our guild Website.

Then, it turned out that I had to go to a backup I had from last May (why more current backups would not work will remain a mystery). A May file, obviously, was going to require that I get many things updated. I did this by looking on line at our existing Website to see what information needed to be changed and what could stay the same. When I finally got things pretty much ship shape, my heart was pounding when decided it was time to get this new information up for all to see. I held my breath and clicked on the "Publish" key - it was successful and I breathed a HUGH sigh of relief.

I am happy to report that, on Saturday, December 9th at 8:15am, I was able to put the final touches on the Website and everything is, once again, up to date and working.

There is one thing I would like to mention. I find that when I use my iPhone or iPad to view the Website - every time I click on any thing it instantly shows up. Not so for MY iMac computer. However, if I wait long enough, everything does eventually work. I first realized this when I was trying to get into Members Only. I put in the code and . . . there it sat . . . it took forever to open up. This is true when I move from one page to another sometimes. I have no idea why this is happening.
